LDAPd is a pure Java LDAP v3 protocol, RFC 2251 compliant server. It's architecture is based on Matt Welsh's Staged Event Driven Architecture (SEDA). It is a componentized application that is designed for a number of runtime scenarios and initially delivered for Apache's Phoenix container. LDAPd reuses many Jakarta based components - Commons-Collections, Jakarta-RegExp, Jakarta-ORO as well as Avalon components and frameworks. Please see the LDAPd website for more information....
